# Emergency Shelter

The Emergency Shelter at Interfaith Partnership for the Homeless assists individuals experiencing Homelessness by providing shelter and supportive case management services to maximize self-sufficiency.

A new 2 story building was constructed for the Emergency Shelter in 2004. This 13,000 square foot space houses a 30 bed shelter with separate dorms for 14 men and 10 women. An additional dorm provides shelter for either six (6) women or six (6) men - depending on the need. A single room is also available for transgender or severely disabled individuals. 52% of Interfaith's emergency shelter clients have no source of income. Case Managers at Interfaith's Emergency Shelter provide services which help clients obtain employment, housing, transportation etc.



### Facts about Interfaith's Emergency Shelter

- Average length of stay is 43 days
- Served over 11,000 meals in 2007
- Breakfast is provided on Mondays and Fridays for individuals in the community who otherwise would go without a meal.
- 285 unduplicated individuals are assisted annually.
- Interfaith's shelter is filled to capacity 98% of the time.
- In 2007 Interfaith saw more individuals with chronic mental and physical disorders.
